In recognition of the 82nd Anniversary of the arrival of the Dunera Boys at the Hay Internment and POW Camps 7 and 8 in 1940. (unfortunately the 80th anniversary was postponed in 2020)

March from railway carriage to Dunera Place to *March of the Hebrew Slaves* from Verdi opera, *Nabucco*.

DEPART HAY RAILWAY STATION

Follow "Dunera Way" from the station to Camps 7 and 8 by car convoy. Tour of Camps 7 and 8, Racecourse/Showground, Garrison areas. Stop at Dunera Commemorative Obelisk in Dunera Way. The obelisk was unveiled at the 50th anniversary in 1990.

12.30 Two course Lunch (Hay Services Club)

Launch of Video (Seumas Spark) which tells the Dunera story from an artistic perspective.

There will also be two pieces of music by Chris Latham a musician from the Australian War Memorial. One of the pieces will be a composition of Boaz Bischofswerder, a composer who was deported to Australia on the Dunera.

3.30 pm Visit Hay General Cemetery – Visit the grave of Menasche Bodner, the only Dunera Boy who died in Hay, now buried in the Jewish section at Hay Cemetery.
